Introduction

Little Flower English Medium School is run by St. Thomas Province of the Little Flower Congregation (CST Fathers). "Be Little, Serve the Little" is the mission of the Little Flower Congregation. Our approach is the realization of this vision and mission through the proclamation of the kingdom values, empowerment of the marginalized and the

disadvantaged sections, priestly ministry, proclamation of the word of God and education ministry.

Little Flower English Medium School at Chelavoor had its humble beginning in 1998 at St. Thomas Bhavan (CST Provincial house) at the request of the local people. It is a Religions Minority institution established primarily for the education of the local community.

The CST Education Policy

1. To mould young persons intellectually competent, morally upright, socially committed and spiritually inspired citizens at the service of India and the world of today and tomorrow by imparting holistic and personalized education.
2. Academic and research competencies, Creative thinking and innovative discoveries.
3. Self discipline, respect for the dignity of the human person, openness to others and awareness of our social situations.
4. Emotional maturity, healthy values and habits, authenticity and contentment in life.
5. Effective communication skills, self study and concentration.
6. Emotional guidance and career education.

Admission and withdrawal

1. Admission is open to all depending upon the norms of selection and the availability of seats.
2. Every candidate for admission must be introduced by the parents/guardian who will be responsible for his/her conduct, progress in studies, discipline and payment of fees.
3. Application for admission shall be made in the prescribed form signed by the parent / guardian of the pupil and birth certificate and Aadhar shall be produced.
4. Students registering from other schools must produce the transfer certificate (TC) before admission.
5. Transfer Certificate will be issued only when the parent/guardian applies for it. Those who apply for TC should pay the fees due till date of application.

School Year

The school year is from June to March. The working hours are from 8.45 am to 3:30 pm. There will be 8 hours a day.

Morning Assembly

The school assembly will be held on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Curriculum

The school follows the curriculum and syllabus of the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi. Hindi and Malayalam are additional languages taught. Students are prepared for the above mentioned Board of Examination.

Examinations

The academic progress of the student is tested by the means of class tests and two semester examinations. Students are not allowed to absent themselves from tests or examinations without the permission of the Principal. The tests and exams will not be conducted second time. The reports of the tests will be recorded in the progress card for the information of the parents or guardian. Grades are given below to show their progress.

Promotion

Promotion to the higher class is based on the performance of the student in all the examinations throughout the year and internal assessment as follows:

1. 80 % marks for the written Exams.
2. 20% marks in internal assessment.
3. General progress in campus behaviour.
4. Staff evaluation report.
5. 90% of attendance.

Emotional Guidance & Counselling

With the help of qualified clinical psychologists our school helps students in managing their emotional problems in relation to their personality, school life, curriculum, career and study.

Payment of Fees

1. The school fee will be collected in four instalments in the following dates.
I Instalment : 13th June to 05th July, 2025
II Instalment : 08th Aug. to 06th Sep., 2025
III Instalment : 07th Nov. to 05th Dec., 2025
IV Instalment : 06th Jan. to 06th Feb., 2026
2. Fees should be paid through The Federal Bank or Calicut City Co-operative Bank. A fine of 5.00 per day will be charged after the due date.
3. The fee receipts are to be retained and produced on demand.
4. Parents can also make online payment of tuition fee through the E-fee portal facility given in the school website.

Co-Curricular Activities

The School promotes and preserves the basic culture of our nation. Therefore the school fosters a high degree of competency in several co-curricular and extra curricular activities. Study of General Knowledge is compulsory for all students. Scholarship exams, IQ test, Memory test, and other various competitive tests are encouraged in the school, which will enhance the rational, analytical and linguistic capacities of our children.

The school provides training in Bharatanatyam, Indian Folk Dance, Carnatic Vocal Music, Drawing and Painting. Arts Festivals are conducted every year to encourage the hidden talents of our students.

Rule of Language

Our institution, being an English Medium school, that prepares students for CBSE Examinations, is dedicated to foster and maintain good communicative skills. Therefore, students should speak English in class rooms, school premises, bus stops etc. Violation of this will invite disciplinary actions.

General Rules

1. The school hours are from 8.45 am to 3.30 pm daily. The students should reach the school premises at least 15 minutes before the commencement of the school.
2. No student can leave the school premises during the school hours without Principal's permission.
3. Pupil coming late to the school loses the benefit of the attendance for the day concerned. He/She will not be allowed to enter his / her class without the permission of the Principal. If late for more than 5 times after due warning he/she will not be allowed to attend the class.
4. If the required percentage of attendance is not put in, the pupil will not be allowed to appear for the annual examination.
5. It is the responsibility of parents to see that

their children are not prone to taking leave. Leave will be granted only in exceptional cases and prior sanction must be obtained unless in an emergency or on medical grounds.

6. Application for leave up to 2 days should be submitted to the respective class teachers, while that for more than 3 days should be addressed to the Principal. If a student is continuously absent for more than 7 days without authorization, his / her name will be removed from the rolls.
7. Application for leave must be signed by parents / guardians and must ordinarily be sent in advance for sanction. Application on medical grounds should be countersigned by an appropriate medical authority.
8. Any damage to the property of the school will have to be made good.
9. No child suffering from contagious diseases will be allowed to attend the class. Withdrawal of the children from classes during school time is not permitted. Parents, who want to take their children to hospital, etc. are advised not to send their children to school.
10. In any non-scholastic competitions when a student is selected to represent the school, he / she is expected to be present for it.
11. After the inter-school competition the parents are requested to pick their wards from the venue or from the school.
12. For any inter school competitions registration fees and other fees should be borne by the students.
13. The school reserves the right to dismiss the students whose diligence or progress in studies is consistently unsatisfactory or whose conduct is harmful to other students or whose parents show little interest in the progress of their wards.
14. The receipts issued by the school office for the payment of the school fees, bus fees, etc., should be produced whenever asked for.

15. Students should label the things they bring to the school with marks by which they can be identified if they are lost. The school authorities will not be responsible for the loss of the articles brought by students.

Rules of conduct

1. Student should attend school in the prescribed uniform.
2. The school uniform should be clean and tidy. Students who are not smartly dressed may be sent home.
3. Students should assemble class-wise for the morning assembly.
4. Every student must behave respectfully towards the members of the staff.
5. Every student shall have with him/her the text books and note books required for the class he/she attends. No newspapers, periodicals, comics, etc. other than school books shall be brought to the school.
6. Home assignments shall be done regularly and carefully and submitted at the stipulated time.
7. The school premises and surroundings should be kept neat and tidy. Unwanted paper bits should be put into waste paper baskets. It is the duty of the students to keep their class rooms absolutely clean.
8. Student's behaviour should be gentlemanly at all times and in all places both inside and outside the school. No shouting or whistling is permitted.
9. No student shall enter or leave the class room after the lesson has begun without the permission of the teacher.
10. No student shall disturb another class at work on the flimsy plea of borrowing a pen, pencil or book from his/her friend.
11. Jewellery must not be worn in the school. Girls are advised to wear studs only.
12. Staff and students are expected to speak English in the class rooms, school premises, school bus and at bus stops.

13. Students should have respect to school property, they should not scratch or damage school furniture, write or draw on the walls. Any damage to school property will have to be made good.
14. Students shall not borrow, lend or exchange money or articles.
15. Playing in class rooms and on corridors are strictly prohibited.
16. Parents are required to see that their children come to school with proper haircut and hairstyle.
17. When passing along corridors during class hours students shall keep silence. Whenever they have to move to the laboratory, computer room, auditorium, library, etc. they should do so in an orderly manner and by not disturbing the neighbouring classes.
18. Students should realize that they are responsible to the authorities of the school not only for their conduct in school but also for their general behaviour in and outside.
19. Students should be polite and courteous and greet their teachers and elders on his / her first meeting in the school premises.
20. When the teacher enters the classroom, the students shall rise and remain standing till they are asked to sit or till the teacher takes his / her seat.
21. Students should cherish the sweet memories of their happy school life with love and gratitude and speak well of the school.
22. Students should abjure cheating and stealing.
23. All school business must be transacted at the school office during the prescribed working hours.
24. Students are prohibited from bringing mobile phones or any electronics gadgets unless they get special permission from the Principal.

25. Every student must get acquainted with the rules and regulations of the school given in this handbook besides the timely instructions given by the authorities through public announcements or by notices issued by the Principal.

Library Rules

1. The school maintains a well equipped library and a reference room.
2. Silence is to be maintained in the library at all times.
3. The school library is opened on working days only.
4. Library books can be issued and returned only during the library period of the class and not in any other teaching period.
5. Each student is given a library card and can have one book at a time.
6. Exchange of library card is not permitted.
7. Library card must be kept carefully.
8. Books may be kept for two weeks and must be returned on the date given. If needed renewal for a third week will be granted.
9. Students who keep books longer than the time permitted will have to pay ₹ 5/- per day. The amount is to be paid at the school office counter.
10. Books in the reference session may not be taken out of the library.
11. Never damage a library book in any way. The damage on books should be brought to the notice of the librarian.
12. All books taken from the library should be returned two weeks before the annual examination.

Parental Co-operation

- a) The school expects that parents will supervise the studies of their children and will take keen interest in their day to day needs like uniform, haircut, notebooks, etc.
- b) Please visit the school and meet the

Principal and teachers on days set apart for parent-teacher meetings to know the progress of your wards.

- c) The co-operation of parents is indispensable for better performance of their wards.
- d) Exemption for students from attending assembly, physical training and games will only be granted on medical grounds.
- e) Parents must encourage their children to take part in the co-curricular and extra-curricular activities of the school.
- f) All efforts made by the teachers with regard to student's training can bear fruit, only if parents co-operate. Hence they are requested to visit the school to meet the teachers on days scheduled for the purpose.
- g) They can acquaint themselves with attendance, progress and conduct of their children / wards.
- h) Parents are not allowed to meet teachers when they are in their classes. Parents desirous of speaking to teachers about the progress of their children may meet teachers by prior appointment and after taking permission from the Principal.
- i) Entrusting a student to the school implies that parents agree to stand by the rules and regulations of the school and they should see that children also abide by the school regulations.
- j) Please check your child's diary and note the home work given and see that it is done on time.
- k) Daily reports about students, if any, shall be conveyed through the hand book.

Parents are expected to sign these reports on the same day. If not duly signed the handbook, the ward will not be allowed to attend the class.

- l) Parents shall prepare a time-table for home study with the help of the class teacher.
- m) No private tuition by the teachers of the school is entertained.
- n) If parents have any problems regarding their wards academics, behaviour or punishments, they are requested to bring them to the notice of the Principal immediately.
- o) Parents may meet the Principal for any information or for making any complaints. No complaints should be made direct to the class teacher.
- p) Parents will ensure that:
 - ❖ Fees are paid on scheduled dates.
 - ❖ They attend parent's meeting.
 - ❖ Children attend school in the proper uniform and with the required books.
 - ❖ Children get enough time at home for lessons and assignments.
 - ❖ Children fill in the fees column with the Receipt No. and date.
- q) No alteration shall be made in the prescribed uniform pattern.

Amendment of Rules

The Principal / Management has the right to introduce, amend or change these rules and regulations whenever necessary in furtherance of the aims and objectives of the school.

School Bus Service

1. School bus facility will be available with effect from the beginning of the school year subject to the availability of accommodation.
2. Once the bus facility is availed, it is presumed the same will be used for the whole year.
3. While waiting for the bus, students should be mindful of good manners and good behaviour. Playing at the bus stops is not allowed.
4. Students must observe queue system to get into the bus.
5. Students should not put their hands or head out while travelling, nor should they fight, push and pull in the bus.
6. Students should be courteous and well disciplined in the bus.
7. Senior students must see to the seating arrangements of the smaller ones before they are seated.
8. Bus seats and chassis should not be damaged by tearing the seat cover or dumping bags on them.
9. Students must speak English in the bus and at bus stops and obey the bus crew.
10. Any student causing annoyance to other students in the bus will be debarred from further use of the bus and will also be liable to further disciplinary action.
11. If, for any reason the management is not able to run the bus, no substitute arrangement will be done.
12. Monthly fee payment for the school bus must be made in the preceding month.

Removal from the Rolls

A student shall have his/her name removed from the rolls on any of the following reasons:

- a) If he/she is absent without informing the Principal for 7 consecutive working days at any time during the year.
- b) If he / she has failed a second time in any of the classes.
- c) If he / she does not pay the fees of a term within 15 consecutive working days after the expiry of the last day of remittance with fine.
- d) If Parent/Guardian does not comply with the request of the Principal to withdraw the students from the school.
- e) If Parent / Guardian does not report to the Principal when called to do so within three days after he/she is in receipt of the message.
- f) The Principal reserves the right of refusing continued studies to any students whose conduct is found not satisfactory or who is not gaining benefit by his / her study in this school or is a bad influence on others. Misbehaviour in school, school bus, bus stops, public places, and streets are sufficient reason for dismissal from the school.

Use of Hand Book

Students must have a copy of Hand book and bring it to the school every day even on examination days. Parents/guardians are requested to go through the Handbook daily. It is a useful channel of communication between parents and teachers.
