

Annual Report 24-25

It is with great pride and joy that we present the Annual Report for the academic year 2024-25. Our guiding theme, "To Be the Light of the World" has inspired every member of Little Flower School community to lead with purpose, serve with compassion, and shine with excellence. This report reflects our collective journey, the milestones we've achieved, the challenges we've overcome, and the light we continue to share with the world around us.

The academic year commenced with Fr. Dileep James assuming the role of Principal and Fr. Jyothis Sebastian taking charge as the Finance Manager. The school began the year with a dynamic team of dedicated teachers and efficient non-teaching staff. A few teachers left the institution for various reasons. But the academic year progressed with the commitment and dedication of the entire Little Flower community

Academic Achievements

The new academic year commenced on June 3rd, as the school reopened after the summer vacation for classes LKG to Std X. The students of Std XI joined a few days later, on June 9th. To ensure a strong start to the year, PTA meetings were conducted for all classes, fostering communication and collaboration between parents and teachers.

Board Exam Results

One of the key highlights of the month was the Merit Day celebration, held to honour the outstanding academic achievements of students from Std X and Std XII. This event was combined with the Investiture Ceremony, where the newly elected school parliament members were formally inducted and entrusted with their responsibilities.

The school takes pride in the remarkable board exam results this year. In Std X, 11 students secured above 90%, with Niranjan R Vineet (96.4%) emerging as the topper. In Plus Two, 14 students scored above 90%, with Anushka R (97%) achieving the highest marks. Our students have achieved remarkable success in the CBSE Board Examinations of 2025 making us proud with their exceptional performance.

Class X Highlights-

2 students scored 100/100 in science, a historic first.

- 1 student scored 100/100 in Mathematics, also a historic first.
- 5 students scored 100/100 in Information Technology.
- 1 student scored 100/100 in Malayalam after a 5-year gap.
- 8 students achieved A1 in all subjects.
- 26 students scored above 90%.
- Our top two students scored 99.2%.

Class XII Highlights

- 1 student each scored 100/100 in Chemistry and Computer Science.
- 3 students achieved A1 in all subjects.
- 9 students scored above 90%.
- Our school topper scored 95.4%.

This achievement reflects the vision of our pioneers, the hard work of our teachers, and the dedication of our students. We look forward to continued excellence. One student with a compartment exam in Mathematics in Plus Two will need to clear the exam to progress.

Olympiads and Competitions.

The school has collaborated with agencies such as the Science Olympiad Foundation, Sarvodaya Scholarship Exams, and DCL to conduct Olympiad exams across various subjects. In nearly nine Olympiad exams, a significant number of students won cash prizes and medals.

Afan Gafoor Nellikkel and John Saban of Class 9 secured the second runner-up position, winning a cash prize of rupees1 lakh in the Unveiling India quiz conducted by the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade in collaboration with ZEE Media.

Afan Gafoor Nellikel, a promising student, along with Adelino Alesar, of class 7, achieved 6th place in the All-India level quiz competition hosted by Little Flower School, Punjab. Srehari G Nair of Class 10 was selected as one of the ten members of the team chosen by Asianet for the Proud to be Indian program a visit to Dubai and historical places of India.

Non-Academic Achievements:

Sports and Games

The school intentionally gives importance to sports and other physical activities, as a healthy mind resides in a healthy body. Track 25, the two-day annual sports meet, was held on September 27 & 28. Students from various houses competed in games and track events.

We never miss any opportunity in sports that arises during the academic year. The game of badminton always enthralled our students Muhammad Sahil and Gautam V Padikkal bagged the runners up prize in the state-level badminton competition. Many of our students secured prizes in individual and group events at the Sahodaya Sports Meet. Many students showcased their expertise in roller skating at competitions held at the district and state levels. One notable name in this arena is Mohammed Hilal M.M. of standard IV.

Sargotsav and Malabar Sahodaya.

Sargotsav 25, the two-day arts fest, was held with Ku: Vedalakshmi, the budding singer, as the chief guest. The Flowerites showcased their talents in various art forms. During the valedictory function, prizes were awarded to the best House. The winners of Sargotsav were later taken to the cultural fest organized by Malabar Sahodaya in the month of October.

Students from various categories excelled in the event, securing A grades, and a few were also selected for the state-level competitions. The year was marked by the enthusiastic participation of teachers in the Malabar Sahodaya Teachers' Fest. Our teachers brought pride to the school by securing prizes in various events.

Little Flower's Signature

LIBA, the South Indian Basketball Tournament, was held on November 29 & 30 and with a total of 16 teams participating in both boys' and girls' categories.

The fourth edition of LIFE, our flagship inter-school competition, was a major highlight of the academic year. The event was expertly coordinated by Mr. Manu Antony, Head of the Business Management Department at St. Joseph's College, Devagiri. A total of 55 teams from various schools enthusiastically participated in the event, showcasing innovation, teamwork, and competitive spirit. The team from Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan emerged the winner.

Annual Day.

A fabulous Annual Day, Flores Iris, was held on December 16th, ensuring maximum participation from students. Father Paul Kurikkattil, the Manager of Devagiri Institutions, was the Chief Guest. An exclusive Annual Day celebration, Flores 25, and a colorful convocation ceremony for KG were conducted in the months of February and March, respectively.

Celebrations and Day Observations.

The school campus comes alive with vibrant colors during festival celebrations. The designated committee promptly swings into action, gathering students to present a grand show. Occasionally, teachers also join in to showcase their talents. Celebrations such as Independence Day, Onam, Teacher's Day, Children's Day, and Christmas are conducted with great enthusiasm and fervor. These events feature cultural performances, competitions, and fun games that add to the festive spirit. Special guests are often invited to share the joy of the celebrations.

In accordance with CBSE guidelines, certain day observations are mandatory and are conducted during special assemblies. These include speeches, placard displays, and pledgetaking. Such observations instill a sense of responsibility, highlight the uniqueness of our culture, and promote environmental awareness.

Orientations and Workshops

The school organized a series of workshops and orientation programs aimed at equipping students, teachers, and parents with essential skills, insights, and motivation for a productive academic year. In November, Mr. Edmund Dantise, the Principal of SSDV Vidyapeeth Maharashtra conducted a session for teachers, familiarizing them with CBSE circulars and

the goals of the National Education Policy (NEP). During the same month, a career guidance session was held for students of Grades 10 and 12.

Dr. Nivya N.K., Assistant Professor at KMCT College, delivered a session on adolescent health for students from Grades 8 to 12. Additionally, Dr. Varsha Vidhyadharan, Assistant Professor of Psychiatry at the Medical College, addressed parents on the topic of positive parenting.

Career Guidance classes for Classes 9 to 12 was held, providing clarity on UG courses and career paths based on their interests and strengths. Cyber Security Awareness classes aim to equip students with essential knowledge about online safety, helping them understand cyber threats and adopt safe practices in the digital world.

Furthermore, teachers were deputed to various venues to attend capacity-building programs organized by CBSE and Malabar Sahodaya. As per CBSE guidelines, health check-ups and awareness classes were also conducted for students.

Students from Kindergarten to Standard 12 enjoyed an exciting trip to various destinations, creating joyful memories with their close friends. Meanwhile, the teachers also had a refreshing two-day trip to Goa, which served as a wonderful opportunity to strengthen companionship and foster team spirit.

Infrastructure Development.

To promote holistic development and enhance learning experiences, the school has undertaken key infrastructure upgrades. The playground has been widened to better facilitate various sports activities and provide ample space for physical development. Additionally, a state-of-the-art computer lab has been established exclusively for students of Classes 1 to 4, paving the way for the introduction of coding classes at the primary level.
