OTHER ACTIVITIES OF THE SCHOOL

PRE- PRIMARY SECTION

Pre-primary education is incredibly vital as it forms the fundamental bedrock for a child's overall development, significantly impacting their future academic and social success. By providing a structured yet nurturing environment, it helps children build confidence, learn crucial social skills like sharing and cooperation, and cultivates a lifelong love for learning, ultimately preparing them effectively for primary schooling and beyond. With 173 students and 9 staff members, our Kindergarten section is thriving, offering innovative activities that promote a love for learning and books.

In accordance with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, we focus on the **holistic development** of each child, encompassing physical, cognitive, socio-emotional, language & literary and aesthetic development. To track progress, we have designed a unique **Holistic Progress Card**, framed under the guidance of NEP 2020.

The academic year unfolded as a canvas of joyful learning for our KG children, offering them umpteen opportunities to explore, experience, and express. . Colors Day with separate days dedicated to each colour. Rainbow Day painted their world with imagination and vibrance, while Shapes Day helped them discover learning through playful exploration.

Ethnic Day introduced them to the beauty of culture and tradition, and Jungle Day awakened their love for nature and wildlife. Healthy Tiffin Day gently instilled healthy food habits, and Friends Day nurtured the values of sharing, bonding, and togetherness.

Through these delightful day observations, our KG classrooms transformed into joyful spaces of experiential learning, where little hearts learned big lessons in happiness, harmony, and holistic growth.

We also have notice boards for different clubs where the club members show case their talents.

TOUR AND PICNIC

A picnic with friends is like a breath of fresh air for the soul. It refreshes the students with a change from their routine life. KG to IV students were taken for a one day trip to Sky wave amusement & water theme park, Kakkadampoyil. A one day educational trip to Kodaikkanal was a memorable experience for class V, VI, VII & VIII. X, XI and XII students were taken for a two day trip to Kodaikkanal & Ramakkalmedu. Class IX was taken on a 2 days trip to Mysore and Coorg.

COUNSELLING FACILITY

Our school provides counselling support to ensure the emotional well-being of students. A qualified counsellor is available at all times to guide and support students in their personal, academic, and social concerns. The counselling service helps students feel heard, understood, and confident in facing challenges.

LIFE SKILLS AND MORAL AWARENESS PROGRAMMES

As part of the school's Life Skills and Moral Awareness Programmes, a series of structured sessions were organised to equip students with essential values, responsible decision-making skills, and social awareness necessary for holistic development.

On 26 June 2025, International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking was observed with an informative session led by Sreekumar K.T., Sub Inspector, Kerala Police, for 118 students, creating strong awareness about the dangers of substance abuse and the importance of making wise choices.

A Mental Health Awareness class was conducted on 11 July 2025 by Dr. Priya Praphul from Iqra Hospital for 124 students, emphasising emotional well-being, stress management, and the significance of seeking timely support.

On 18 September 2025, a Citizen Awareness class was led by Mr. Umesh Nanminda, District Coordinator of Janamithri Police, Beat Police Station, Chevayoor, benefitting 131 students and encouraging active, responsible participation in society. On the same day, Sr. Dr. Navya S.H. and Dr. Anula K.P. conducted an informative session on Adolescence and Puberty for 142 students, promoting healthy understanding, self-awareness, and personal hygiene.

Further enhancing digital responsibility, an awareness session on Cyber Addiction was conducted on 13 October 2025 by Rev. Fr. Dr. Gimmi Akkattu CST, Psychologist, for 136 students, highlighting safe and balanced use of technology.

MEDICAL CAMP

Under the school's health and wellness initiatives, several medical programmes were organised to ensure the physical well-being of students and to promote preventive healthcare practices across all classes.

A week-long medical camp was conducted from 10 September to 19 September on behalf of Aster MIMS for students from Pre-KG to Class XII, during which cases of severe myopia and obesity were identified and duly reported to parents for further medical follow-up.

Deworming tablets were administered to approximately 3,700 students as part of a preventive health measure to ensure improved nutrition and overall well-being.

Iron and Folic Acid tablets were distributed every Monday to students of Classes VI to XII to address anaemia and promote better health.

The JE vaccination drive was conducted on 15 January 2026 for children below the age of 15, strengthening immunity and safeguarding them against Japanese Encephalitis.

INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC , DANCE AND OTHER CCA ACTIVITIS

Music gives a soul to the universe, wings to the mind, flight to the imagination and life to everything.

Dance like music ,is the expression of the human spirit. It is a visual music. To enlighten the interest of the students in music and dance classes on musical instruments like violin, keyboard and guitar are provided during the CCA hours. The students are also provided with eastern and western dance classes. It helps them to touch the summit of music and dance with no effort. Kalari ,Chess, Drawing, Basketball and Football are also included.

MARTIAL ARTS AND SKATING

Karate and skating are both fantastic for developing well-rounded individuals, offering unique blends of physical and mental benefits..
